Sport Premium Planning and Evaluation Outline 2021-2022

During the academic year of 2021-2022, North Heath CP School will be receiving government funding to improve the provision of PE and sport.

Key Indicators: 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity; 2. The profile of PESSPA (PE School Sport and Physical Activity) being raised across the school; 3. Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE; 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities; 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

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| 1 | To install, train and begin to embed an orienteering course | £1700 (planned) £0 (spent) | Order and organise the orienteering package to be installed. Book staff training with the company Include orienteering into long-term PE planning | Staff meeting completed with high engagement across teachers. Resources for initial lessons are being collated in a central store. This half term, teachers will roll out introduction to orienteering lessons to increase active learning in PE and across the curriculum. |
| 1 | Improve the performance during the daily mile to give all pupils guaranteed exercise every day. | £500 (planned) £0 (spent) | Repair Daily Mile to avoid trip hazard Adults to encourage pupils to jog/walk briskly, and take part themselves. Introduce a challenge – run a marathon; travel from A-B (challenges available on Daily Mile website) | Daily mile track assessed to be in adequate condition. Track is used regularly to allow an all-weather surface for running. The SDP for 2022-2023 focuses on new ‘run a marathon’ challenges to reinvigorate engagement in the daily mile. |
| 2 | For the children of North Heath to be recognisable and looking fit for purpose during competitions | £500 (planned) £445 (spent) | Audit sports kit and order new if necessary Order gum shields and hockey shin pads as a bank stock. | Sports kit replenished as needed - ensured pupils felt pride in representing the school at competitions. The SDP for 2022-2023 will allow purchase of gum shields and shin pads. Hockey goalie kit was ordered to allow entry to competition and hockey grips were replaced for the competition. |
| 2 | To celebrate PE and Sport Success | £500 (planned) £0 (spent) | Noticeboard to be updated regularly Purchase trophies to celebrate participation and achievement Update School Website and newsletter with competition reports. | Newsletters have reported sporting achievements to the community which has raised the profile of sport at North Heath. Trophies have not been purchased at this point. |
| 3 | Increase knowledge and skills of staff when teaching sports leading to lesson improvement | £5000 (planned) £4140 (spent) | Book Lions Sports Coach to teach across the school x1 day a week for the year. Coach will provide half termly sessions for each year group, with the intention of up-skilling staff and preparing pupils for upcoming sports competitions. | Lions Sports have provided curriculum support which has enhanced pupil engagement in the taught areas of: TAG rugby, athletics, multi-sports. Some pupils have taken up extra sport sessions and clubs due to their enjoyment of the coaching sessions. Class teachers have embedded activities from sessions into PE lessons to create more varied and more active opportunities for the pupils. |
| 3 | Develop teachers confidence and skill level for teaching dance | £3000 (planned) £4290 (spent) | KICKS dance to provide curriculum support for specific year groups throughout the autumn and spring term | Kicks Dance have provided high-energy sessions which has enhanced pupil engagement and variety in our PE provision. Teacher confidence in delivering the dance curriculum has increased. |
| 4 | Improve the quality of teaching and learning of athletics, stoolball and cricket | £2000 (planned) £1760 (spent) | Replenish equipment. Arrange Chance to Shine coaching for the summer term. Enter athletics and cricket competitions. | Chance to Shine were unavailable for sessions this year. Athletics and cricket competitions were entered with high pupil engagement. Increased entry to competitions has raised the profile of sport in the school across all KS2 year groups. |

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| 5 | Participation in locality and West Sussex competitions, and introduce additional competitive sports lower down the school | £3000 (planned) £1830 (spent) | Enter into the following competitions at the very least: Hockey, netball, indoor athletics, district sports, rounders, cricket, tag rugby. Find out about events for KS1 | Entry to all these events has raised the profile of sport at North Heath. The competitions gave our more-able sportsmen the opportunity to partake at a higher level and partake against more-able pupils from other schools – developing their skillset further. In addition to those listed, North Heath entered: Y3/4 badminton New-Age Kurling and Alternative sports festivals which exposed pupils to a wider range of sports and activities. |
| | Enable additional provision of swimming to ensure as many pupils can swim competently by end of KS2 | £925 (planned) £925 (spent) | Book additional swim session for Y4 pupils not yet able to swim 25m. Book coach and arrange staffing. | 57 Year 4 pupils had swimming lessons in the Spring term with 17 pupils having additional top up swimming lessons in the Summer term to ensure 25m competency. |
| 1 | To increase the area that pupils have to play, be active and take part in PE lessons in by removing the trim-trail and resurfacing the playground surface | £500 (planned) £3,300 (spent) | Contribute towards the cost of expanding the top playground by removing the old disused equipment and laying new surface. | Increased playground size has resulted in more space for pupils to be active at break times. More importantly, the space enables an additional class PE session or coaching session to be timetabled and to take place with the increased area. |
| | To encourage active play at break times | £0 (planned) £2,700 (spent) | Lay playground markings in the front playground to enable active play and active opportunities for learning across the curriculum | Pupils have enjoyed using the new markings to reinvigorate active games at break times. The hundred-square has also enabled active cross-curricular learning. |
