Dear Parent/s and Carer/s,

We look forward to welcoming all our pupils and parents back to school on Wednesday 4th September after what has hopefully been a refreshing, relaxing holiday for everyone. Over the last few weeks Mr Gildea and I met to complete the handover of the school and I am delighted to be able to start the year as North Heath's Interim Headteacher. I am looking forward to a positive and interesting term ahead. In this role, I will be on the front playground to open the gates in the morning (whenever possible) and I look forward to seeing many of you and your children before school each day – please pop by to say hello!

Staffing

We welcome two new teachers to our amazing team. Miss Dew will be the class teacher for Y5 Rowan and Mrs Teakle joins us in Y6 Whitebeam.

Teachers are already back at school and have been busy with safeguarding training, developing the curriculum and organising their classrooms so that the children have the best possible start to the year. As always, teachers will be waiting at the external doors to welcome the children from 8:40am. Although they will happily give you a wave at this time, it would be helpful to pass on any messages through the school office or via the year group emails, so that teachers and classroom assistants can focus on settling their pupils.

Teacher meetings

This year, parents will have an opportunity to hear from their children's teachers at the beginning of term. Each year group will offer a 10-15 minute talk that will explain the main events and expectations for the year ahead. The teachers will talk through homework and how best to support your children at home as well as upcoming topics, trips and other events in school. Please see the dates and timings in the table below. It would be great to see as many of you as possible for these meetings as they will help home and school work together for the benefit of all children. However, as there is quite short notice of the meetings, we appreciate it may be difficult for some parents to attend and so all presentations will be saved on the school website. These should provide the key details of the meeting but you can use the year group emails if you have any other questions.

Parents of Reception pupils will have an opportunity to meet the teachers at their meeting later on this term in addition to the home visits taking place over the next 2 weeks.

Parents Consultation Evenings will be held in the Autumn and Spring terms. The electronic booking system will be set up in good time for parent/s and carer/s to sign up and there will be further details about this in a separate letter.

Uniform

All pupils should be in school uniform for their first day. This consists of their yellow polo shirt and trousers/shorts/skirt or a yellow summer dress, a grey school or unbranded jumper/sweatshirt or cardigan and a coat. They should have black shoes that are suitable for playtimes as well as all-day wear. Plain black trainers can be used in place of standard school shoes.

For school, hair should be neat and we ask that hair of shoulder length or longer to be tied up during the day. Pupils should not wear make up or nail varnish. Small hoops or stud earrings can be worn in school as can a necklace with a religious charm but no other jewellery is permitted. Watches can be worn in school but pupils will be asked to remove them for PE.

PE days for each class will be agreed and shared by the end of this week. On PE days, pupils will be expected to come to school in their PE kits with either a plain hoodie (ideally black or grey) or their school jumper. They should also wear trainers that are suitable for all-day wear and that they can put on and take off unaided. Ideally, earrings should be removed at home for PE days as this can be a worry for children at school and adults are not able to help with either removing them or putting them back in.

Site

In this first newsletter, I'd like to remind all parent/s and carer/s that classroom doors open at 8:40am each morning, ready for the register at 8:45am when their teaching and learning will begin. Any later arrivals will be marked as late in the register. The school day finishes at 3:15pm and pupils will be released to parent/s and carer/s from the external doors (YR from the front playground). If you wish your child (Year 4 and above) to walk home alone, or walk round to meet you at another part of the school, please put this in writing for your child's class teacher.

Before and after school, the front and side playgrounds are open for parents to drop off or pick up their children. Please be mindful that parents are responsible for their children until they enter, and after they leave, the classroom. Although, they are free to play under your supervision, we would ask everyone to be considerate of others who are moving about the site. For their safety, children should not be playing on the top playground or behind and between the sheds on the front playground where supervision is challenging.

For safeguarding reasons, we would ask any parents who collect children from the playgroup before the end of North Heath's school day, to wait away from the railings by the front playground until after the infants have had their afternoon play.

Bicycles and scooters can be ridden to school and can be stored during the day using the bike racks provided but please remember that neither should be ridden on the school grounds.

Currently, due to work carried out on the school roof over the summer, there is a scaffolding tower on the front playground. While it is clearly fenced off to prevent pupils from accessing it, we would appreciate your support in reminding pupils to stay well away.
