Rewards and Sanctions



House points:

- For recognition of positive behaviour in the classroom and around school. These points add into the whole school house point system.

Merits:

- Individual rewards for exemplary work and behaviour. Children will need to gain 44 Merits to achieve their Bronze award. Then it will be repeated for their Silver/Gold/Platinum Awards.

Values stickers:

- Children will be rewarded with stickers that reflect our school values. These are: Be Kind, Be Creative, Be Courageous.

Homework

Reading



When should the children change their books?

- Monday mornings children will choose 2 books from their book band box e.g. turquoise
- Daily, children will choose a book from the class reading corner to enjoy at home

How should I record my child's reading?

- Write in their reading diary each time they read. It's helpful to see what the children have read and if they have faced any challenges. We will be collecting diaries in on Monday mornings to look at and sign.

Regular practise of reading Year 1 and 2 common exception words will support reading fluency (little and often makes the greatest impact!)

Assessment



- Ongoing assessments throughout the year
 - Carefully planned lessons and frequent retrieval activities will support the children to remember what they have learned.
 - Song of Sounds phonics assessments (termly)
- *There are no statutory national assessments at the end of KSI*
- We will be using materials that the government produce at the end of the year to support (where necessary) our assessments and judgements

Phonics retake:

Phonics Screening Check - June 2026

- Each pupil reads 40 real/pseudo words 1:1 with their teacher.
