Uniform

As communicated last term, we have made a slight change to our PE kit. The T-shirts have stayed the same: coloured house T shirts with the school emblem or similarly coloured plain T-shirts for PE. For trousers, the PE kit should comprise <u>black tracksuit or jogging trousers</u> or black shorts of an appropriate length. To keep the PE kit appropriate for colder weather, pupils should wear a <u>plain black hoodie or sweatshirt</u> or, failing that, their school cardigan or sweatshirt. These black jumpers should be easily, and cheaply, available and will help us maintain a more consistent appearance on PE days. We would also expect all pupils to wear black trainers that they can put on and do up themselves.

This is a small change but we feel it is important and we appreciate your efforts in supporting us with it.

Morning Snacks

As you know, pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with a fruit snack at school each day. Pupils in Key Stage 2 are also encouraged to bring in a fruit (or vegetable) snack to help see them through the mornings. This year, pupils are going to be eating these snacks in the classroom during a class reading session, rather than in the playgrounds. If you order milk for them, they will also drink the milk during this session.

These snacks should consist of fresh fruit or vegetables rather than processed foods or cereal bars.

Site Safety and Security

It will be exciting for the children and we are making sure that all year groups have an opportunity to see and, where appropriate, use the area during the first few weeks of school. Some of the equipment could be quite challenging for even our oldest children!

Similarly, the school's play equipment and PE sheds are only for use or access during school hours for a range of safety reasons as well as to ensure items are reliably available during the school day. Please help us by reminding children of this, regardless of how tempting extra games time might seem.

Bikes



Cycling is a fun, healthy way to travel to school and we encourage our pupils to come to school on bikes.

However, safety for cyclists, pedestrians and any road users is of utmost importance.

For this reason, pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 participate in Bikeability at North Heath. In Year 5, Level 1 Bikeability ensures pupils have basic cycling skills. In Year 6 they revisit level 1 and, if ready, take the Level 2 course which provides specific training to make sure they are safe on the road.

Following a number of 'near-misses' reported to school by local residents, parents and members of the community, we now ask that pupils do not cycle to school unaccompanied by an adult before gaining their Bikeability level 2. Prior to this, all pupils are welcome to cycle to school and store bikes here during the day but they should be accompanied by an adult.
